hello – **Salve!** (to one person) **Salvete!** (to a group)

hello, students – **Salvete discipuli!**

hello, teacher – **Salve sis, magistra!** (or just ‘salve, magistra’)

What's Your Name/My Name Is...

Quid est nomen tibi? Nomen mihi est...

or Quid est tuum praenomen? Meum praenomen est...

How Are You? + Answers

Ut vales?

Bene valeo / Optime valeo / Haud male valeo / Pessime valeo

or

Quid Agis?

Sum bene / Sum optime / Sum pessime

Goodbye

Vale! (to one person) **Valete!** (to a group)

goodbye, students – **Valete discipuli!**

goodbye, teacher – **Vale magistra!**

Behavior

Commands [to one student/to a group]

stand up – surge! / surgete!
sit down – conside! / considite
come – veni! / venite!
go – i! / ite!
narrate to me/tell me – narra mihi! / narrate mihi!
say – dic! / dicte!
be quiet – tace! / tacete!
listen – audi! / audite!

Politeness

please – quaeleo
thank you – gratias tibi ago / gratias vobis ago
I'm sorry – me paenitet

Beyond Bene 1

Exclamations

good – **bene!** (lit. ‘well,’ as in ‘well done’)

super – **optime!**

cool – **mirum!**

very cool – **vah, mirum!**

awesome – **mirabile!**

that's lit – **macte!**

wow! – **babae! or papae! or tatae!**

nice! (admiring an object) – **heja!**

no way! – **bombax!**

yay! – **io!** (or *io io io!*)

hooray! – **eu! or euax! or euge!**

Beyond Bene 2

“Good Job”

well done – **bene factum!**

well drawn – **bene pictum!**

well said – **bene dictum!**

good job – **recte factum** (literally, ‘done just right’)

nicely done – **belle fecisti** (literally, ‘you did it nicely’)

great job/that's great – **bene mecastor factum** or **bene hercle factum** (lit, ‘well—by Hercules—done!’)

(note: men use hercle or mehercle—By Hercules!; women say mecastor—By Castor!)

I like this – **hoc mihi placet** (literally, ‘this pleases me’)

I like it a lot – **hoc mihi perplacet** (lit., ‘this really pleases me’)

I love it – **hoc me delectat** (literally, ‘this delights me’)

Beyond Bene 3

Specific Praise

magnificent – **(quam) magnificum**

(quam means 'how' or 'oh how...')

spectacular – **(quam) splendidum**

I like that picture – **illa pictura mihi placet**

beautiful handwriting – **chirographum bellum**

good pronunciation – **bene loqueris**

(literally, 'you are speaking well')

it's so cute – **quam bellulum!** (she's so cute: 'quam bellulam')

so funny – **quam jocosum!**

so fun/pleasant – **quam jucundum!**

that's beautiful – **euax nimis bellum!**

(literally, 'hooray so beautiful')

very inspiring – **instincta sum** (if 'I' am a woman) *or* **instinctus sum** (if 'I' am a man)

(literally, 'I am inspired')

very creative – **ingeniosus es** (to a boy) *or* **ingeniosa es** (to a girl)

(lit, 'you are creative/clever/talented')

beautifully said – **formose dictum**

you've got talent – **ingenio abundas**

(literally, 'you are abounding in talent')

Discussion

do you understand? – **intellegis ne? / intellegitis ne?**

I understand – **intellego**

I don't understand – **non intellego**

isn't it? – **nonne?**

it isn't, is it? – **num...?**

do you prefer...or...? – **mavis ne...vel...?**

answer: I prefer – **malo...**

in your opinion... – **sententia tua...**

in my opinion... – **sententia mea...**

what do you like in this story? – **quid tibi placet in hac fabula?**

is it funny, in your opinion? – **est ne jocosum, sententia tua?**

It's strange/amazing, isn't it? – **mirum est, nonne?**

Adagia (Proverbs)

Term 1 – Adagium primum (first proverb):

Ad gloriam per spinas

To glory through the thorns

Term 2 – Adagium secundum (second proverb):

Non nova, sed nove

Not new things, but in a new way

Term 3 – Adagium tertium (third proverb):

Non gladio, sed gratia

Not with the sword, but with kindness

Scripturae

Sept/Oct – Scriptura prima (first scripture):

Dixitque Deus: ‘Fiat Lux’

And God said: ‘Let there be light’

(Genesis 1:3 VULG) (*note: VULG means Vulgate translation*)

Nov/Dec – Scriptura secunda (second scripture):

Gloria in altissimis Deo, et super terram pax in hominibus bonae voluntatis

Glory in the highest places to God, and over the earth peace to people of good will

(Secundum Lucam 2: 14 VULG)

Jan/Feb – Scriptura tertia (third scripture):

Domini est terra, et plenitudo ejus; orbis terrarum, et universi qui habitant in eo.

The Lord's is the earth, and the fullness of it; the globe of the world, and all those who live in it.

(Psalmi 23:1 VULG = 24:1 in Protestant Bibles)

Mar/Apr/May – Scriptura quarta (fourth scripture):

De profundis clamavi ad te, Domine

From the depths I called to you, O Lord

(Psalm 129:1 VULG = 130:1 in Protestant Bibles)

Carmina (Songs)

Sept/Oct – Carmen primum (first song):

O Mira Gratia (Amazing Grace)

O mira quanta gratia
Redemit reum me.
Erranti luxit placida
Blanda mirifice.

Quod magna tot pericula
Iam salvus passus sum
Id Gratiae retribuam
Quae ducet me domum.

Cum saecula viderimus
Ut sol splendentia
Nos modo peregerimus
Laudum initia.

Carmina (Songs)

Nov/Dec – Carmen secundum (second song):

In Dulci Jubilo

In dulci jubilo
Now sing with hearts aglow!
Our delight and pleasure
Lies in praesepio,
Like sunshine is our treasure
Matris in gremio.
Alpha es et O!
Alpha es et O!

O Jesu parvule,
For thee I long alway;
Comfort my heart's blindness,

Antiphona (Call-&-Responses)

Antiphonum primum (First Call & Response): Sursum Corda

<i>Coach says</i>	<i>Coach does</i>	<i>Students respond</i>
Ecce cor	Make a heart with hands Gesture to students to copy	(Make a heart with hands)
Ecce corda	Point to multiple “hearts” (students’ hands)	
Corda deorsum	Hold heart with hands low to the ground Gesture to students to copy	(Hold hearts low to ground)
Sursum corda!	Hold heart up high in the air	(Hold hearts up high)

Antiphona (Call-&-Responses)

Antiphonum secundum (Second Call & Response): Nunc Nox

Words	Motions
Coach: Nunc nox	Cover eyes with hands
Students: Mox lux!	(make “shining” motion, opening fingers near face)

Antiphonum tertium (Third Call & Response): Arma Virumque

Words	Motions
Coach: Arma Virumque...	Strike a noble pose, chest out and chin up
Students: Cano!	(mimic coach)
